Postponement of the 2020 Family Reunion

In light of the recent heath crisis known as the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Council has reached the difficult decision to postpone our much-anticipated Alford Family Reunion. The reunion, which was originally scheduled for this July 9-11, 2020, is now in the process of being rescheduled. We understand that this change in plans will be met with some degree of sadness and disappointment by the family. We did not come to this decision lightly or hastily. We are acting out of an abundance of caution for our family's health and wellbeing.

Our family reunions have always been filled with lots of laughter, hugs, and kisses for our kin from near and far. Unfortunately, it is precisely these elements of close hugs and kisses that lead to the rampant spread of this potentially fatal virus. Now that the statistics are finally coming to reveal that communities of color make up a

disproportionately high number of COVID-19 deaths, our family council feels that the risk is just too great at this time. It is best to exercise wisdom and prudence now, rather than be faced with the possibility of loss and regret later.

Let's plan for our joyful reunification in 2021 after all the weight of this pandemic has passed. Until then, take care of yourselves and each other.



OAAE Honors Lee Virgil Patterson Sr. 'Heart Of A Teacher'

Fame, Inc., (OAAE)
announces the posthumous
induction of career Tulsa
educator and coach Mr. Lee
Virgil Patterson, Sr. as a
member of their 2019 class
of the OAAE Hall of Fame
Inductees. The induction
ceremony was held on
Friday, September 27, 2019
at the Oklahoma History
Center in Oklahoma City.

Lee Virgil Patterson, Sr., born to Charley and Mary Patterson on November 15, 1926, in Okmulgee, Oklahoma, experienced unfortunate circumstances in a family of thirteen children. Despite the obstacles, the children grew up in the State Home of Negro Deaf, Blind and Orphans, known simply as the DB&O in Taft, Patterson and his brother Alfred believed in Oklahoma. an education, therefore; they moved to Tulsa to attend school. They supported themselves as tailors. He graduated high school and went to college on a football scholarship at Shaw University in North Carolina. He missed being at home, so he transferred to Langston University. He suffered an injury which ended his athletic career at Langston University. However, he rebounded with a job as a student coach, and graduated with a B.S. degree in Industrial Arts.

When duty called in 1951, he honored his country by serving in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. Mr. Patterson received the Korean Service Medal, two Bronze Stars and the United Nation's Service Medal.





In 1954, Mr. Patterson began his career in education as a teacher at the Oklahoma State Training School for Boys in Boley, Oklahoma where he taught tailoring, math, woodshop and coached boys' basketball. He later moved to Tulsa where he was hired to teach at Carver Junior High, then McLain High, followed by Hale High in the Tulsa Public Schools where he taught for more than twenty years. His assignments included arts and crafts, drafting and printing.

Mr. Patterson was the consummate educator. He exemplified the "Heart of a Teacher" as described by Paula J. Fox in her book by the same name. "The child arrives like a mystery box with puzzles pieces inside, some of the pieces are broken or missing and others just seem to hide. The heart of a teacher can sort out the puzzle and help the child to see the potential for greatness from within." He would put the pieces together for many young students who entered his woodwork class. His goal was not just to impart knowledge, but also to create a work of art. He understood that the process would be painfully slow at times, but he knew the students would be successful.

In addition, he was from the old school where women were respected; he opened doors and pulled out chairs. He honored family, he wore suits or well-tailored and pressed work clothes to class, and he welcomed new teachers and taught them the ropes. He never shied away from an opportunity to share his craft.

Mr. Patterson's awards and accolades included:
Destination Discovery Inc.'s Volunteer Service Award and the 25th Anniversary Achievement Award; the
Outstanding Service Award-Industrial Arts Award, the
Tulsa Public Schools Department of Vocational Education and Industrial Arts Award; the Certificate of Recognition – Vocational Industrial Arts Clubs of America; Langston
University Alumni Association Outstanding Service Award, the Mid-Western Region Award, and he was a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

A loving husband, Lee Virgil and his wife Violet, (2015 OAAEHOF recipient) celebrated sixty wonderful years of marriage shortly before his death. His legacy of education is seen in the numerous accomplishments of his children and grandchildren. He was a member of the Morning Star Baptist Church of Tulsa for more than seventy 70 years where he faithfully served as Trustee, Deacon, Sunday

School and Vacation Bible School teacher and the Brotherhood Ministry.

Lee Virgil Patterson Sr. prided himself on being a gentleman and a role model for all students, but especially for young African American men. And, although he was known as being a disciplinarian, he also had a wicked sense of humor. Above all, he possessed "The Heart of a Teacher."

Lauren Ashley Beck's Survivor Contestant Recap



Beginning the game on the Vokai tribe, 28 year old Lauren Ashley Beck formed a quick friendship with Tommy Sheehan after they initially bonded over their loved ones. This connection among others allowed Lauren to seemingly form a tight alliance consisting of herself, Tommy, Dan Spilo, Janet Carbin, and Kellee Kim. Under Lauren's direction, the group

blindsided Molly Byman at Vokai's first Tribal Council to weaken her influence on the tribe.

Lauren remained on Vokai after the Tribe Switch on Day 12, alongside allies Dan, Tommy, and Jason Linden, though they found themselves in a precarious 4-4 split against members of the original Lairo tribe. When Vokai lost immunity on Day 16, the four conspired with Aaron Meredith to target Elaine Stott. At Tribal Council, however, Elaine revealed that she had a Vote Blocker advantage, which she used against Jason, ultimately allowing the original Lairo members to vote him out. Now relegated to the minority, Lauren and Tommy attempted to throw Dan under the bus to protect themselves, but the original Lairo contingent became suspicious of them and considered voting out Tommy if they lost again.

When the tribes merged into the Lumuwaku tribe on Day 20, Lauren and Tommy attempted to rekindle their alliance with Janet and Kellee. However, the two sensed that Kellee would not be loyal to their alliance after she entertained the possibility of voting out Dan, resulting in her eventual elimination. When a Double Elimination twist temporarily split up the Lumuwaku tribe on Day 27, Janet appeared to be the next to go due to her previous attempt to take out Dan. However, Lauren and the other former Vokai decided that Aaron was a bigger threat, blindsiding him and reestablishing their original Vokai alliance.

The next day, Lauren volunteered to go to the Island of the Idols, where she accepted the mentors' challenge, which required her to correctly pick who would win the next individual Immunity Challenge in exchange for a Hidden Immunity Idol that would be valid for the following two Tribal Councils. With the players having the option to either eat or compete, Lauren focused all of her energy on convincing everyone except Elizabeth Beisel and Noura Salman, the two players she picked to win immunity, to sit out of the challenge. Noura went on to win the challenge, granting Lauren a Hidden Immunity Idol. However, Karishma Patel's idol play at Tribal Council that night prompted Lauren to play her own idol to be safe. This proved to be for naught, as she did not receive any votes against her and Elizabeth was voted out instead.

On Day 30, Janet and Tommy won the Loved Ones Challenge and decided to take Lauren and Dan with them on the reward. This caused Noura to realize that she was on the outs of their alliance, and she conspired to target Lauren with Elaine, Karishma, and Dean Kowalski because of her strong social game. However, Lauren won immunity, foiling their plan, with Karishma being voted out that night, followed by Elaine. At the final five, Janet attempted to eliminate Lauren with her own idol; however, Lauren and Tommy got Dean to use his Idol Nullifier to cancel Janet's idol, sending her to the jury.

After Noura won the Final Immunity Challenge on Day 38, Lauren was unhappy to hear that even though Noura considered Lauren her "number one ally", she would be facing Dean in the fire-making challenge. Lauren desperately tried to practice making fire, only for Noura to continuously distract her by attempting to explain her decision. At Tribal Council, Lauren was able to start a fire, but ultimately lost to Dean, becoming the tenth and final member of the jury.

At the Final Tribal Council, Lauren asked Tommy who he was most loyal to. Her loyalty to Tommy remained as she voted for him to win the title of Sole Survivor, which he ultimately did in a 8-2-0 vote.

Army veteran Emmett Roberts provides entrepreneurial training for Maryland business owners

After retiring in 2014, Major Emmett Roberts began networking throughout the U.S. to gain insight into



federal contracting to help develop his business. But he quickly noticed one key similarity in most of his discussions—the lack of resources available for veteran-owned businesses.

"I've talked to individuals around the country, I've been to every conference you

can name, and I hear what people are saying—nobody is investing the time to show veterans how to win," said the U.S. Army veteran.

With this realization, Roberts decided to sacrifice the success of his business to support a larger group of veterans. Knowing that his skills and services could be beneficial in his home state of Maryland, he collaborated with fellow local veterans and launched the Maryland Veterans Chamber of Commerce (MDVCC) in May 2018.

"One thing I know about veterans is that they will come together to support the success of other veterans and the success of MDVCC will make the state of Maryland even better," said Roberts. "I'm confident that this organization is necessary to support the success of veteran business owners."

MDVCC provides education for business owners and helps give back to the local economy by supporting entrepreneurial activity throughout the state. The chamber offers a 24-month training program comprised of several different steps to ensure entrepreneurs learn the fundamental principles of owning and operating a business in Maryland. The organization is part of the United States Veterans Chamber of Commerce, which

includes 27 independent state chapters across the country.

"Our incubation program helps those who have business ideas. Participants join our training program and find out who they are—they build their concept, go through business registration, learn about branding, and more," said Roberts. "Every veteran who wants to run a business can join our program and prepare themselves."

For the past 18 months, Roberts has worked to grow MDVCC's network in Maryland and fulfill its mission of helping veterans, veteran-owned businesses, and their families. His goal for the next five years is to see the group and its trainees collectively generate more than \$1 million in revenue for their individual companies. He would also like to collaborate with a number of Maryland's educational institutions to help grow the veteran training program even more.

"Our goal is to make sure veterans are better equipped to run a business than ever before," he said.




